



Faculty Guide

Step by Step Instructions on How to
Import the MUW Plagiarism Tutorials
into Canvas Courses

1. Once inside a course in Canvas, select “Import from Commons” from the right-hand menu.



2. Use the keywords “MUW Plagiarism” to search for The W’s plagiarism modules on Canvas Commons.



3. You'll see two guides. The MUW Plagiarism Tutorial created by Amber Handy is a general-purpose guide suitable for both graduate and undergraduate students. It was originally created by Simon Fraser University and adapted for use at The W by former CTL Director Amber Handy. Dr. Ross Whitwam has also created a module specifically designed for use in science courses. Click the title of whichever suits your course.

6. The pop-up menu will close and a green bar should appear at the top of the Commons page indicating that your import has begun. Navigate back to your course. In several minutes, the Plagiarism Tutorial should appear at the bottom of the modules page.
